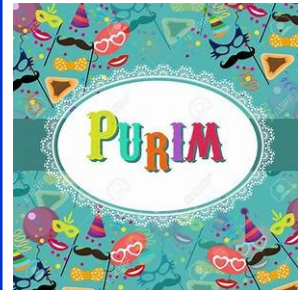
SHABBAT 9 MARCH CIVIC SHABBAT
