

# **TETZAVEH**

13TH ADAR 5777

#### Kohen - First Aliya:

#### Chapter 27, verse 20 - Chapter 28, verse 12

- 4 Hashem Informs Moshe that Bnai Yisrael are to provide pure oil to light the Menorah. Aaron and his sons then will have the responsibility of making sure the Menorah once lit, stays burning continuously.
- Beginning with Aaron as Kohen Gadol, along with his sons The Kohanim (priesthood) lineage is established. Special garments are required to be made and worn on every occasion when they are performing their duties in the Mishkan (sanctuary)
- The Ephod (apron) made from gold, sky-blue & dark red thread, crimson wool and linen must cover the Kohen Gadol's back and front. Held in place by two shoulder straps with a shoam (onyx) stone on which the names of six tribes are engraved on one and the remaining six tribes on the other.

#### Levi - Second Aliya:

#### Chapter 28, verses 13 - 30

- 4 The Hoshen (breastplate) is also made out of the five different materials listed above. It is one cubit in length and half a cubit wide, folded in half to form a square pocket into which the Urim V'tumin (Hashem's Ineffable name) is inserted.
- 4 Four rows of threeprecious stones with one name of the twelve tribes written on each one are mounted onto the front of the Hoshen before attaching it to the Ephod with a gold chain; it must hang down over the Kohen Gadol's heart.

#### Sh'lishi - Third Aliya:

#### Chapter 28, verses 31 - 43

- 4 The length of the K'tonet (tunic), worn by all of the Kohanim, must reach from their necks down to their heels.
- 4 An M'eal (type of sleeveless robe with a hole at the top for the head to go through) is made from sky-blue wool and is worn over the K'tonet.
- 4 Hanging from the bottom of the M'eai are alternating bells and pomegranates made from gold.
- The Tzitz (head-plate) is made from gold with the words 'Holy to Hashem' engraved on it. This is then tied round the Kohen Gadol's forehead.
- In addition to these three other garments: Mihnasayim (shorts), Mitznefat (Hat) and an Avnet (sash) must be worn by both the Kohen Gadol and the rest of the Kohanim.

#### R'VI'I - Fourth Aliya:

#### Chapter 29, verses 1 - 18

- Hashem tells Moshe that he should be the one to install Aaron and his sons as Kohanim by immersing them in the Mikveh
- 4. Moshe was then responsible for dressing them in the clothes described above and anointing them with oil.
- Hashem then enumerates in detail, all the products and animals, which are to be brought and sacrificed by Aaron to commemorate his consecration.
- The whole installation of the Kohanim took seven days.

Chamishi- Fifth Aliya:

Chapter 29, verses 19 - 37 and

Shishi - Sixth Aliya:

Chapter 29, verses 38 - 46

Hashem explains to Moshe which Korbanim (sacrifices) are to be brought onto the Mizbayah on an daily basis; both morning and afternoon, along with other certain rituals like, the waving and sprinkling of the blood for example, which the Kohanim are also required to perform.

#### Sh'vi'i - Seventh Aliya:

#### Chapter30, verses1 - 10

- Finally, Hashem commands Moshe to build a Mizbayah Hak'toret (An altar for burning the incense on); made from wood and covered in gold. The dimensions of the altar must be one cubit in length, one cubit in width and two cubits high.
- Aaron was given the job to burn incense on it every morning and evening.

# Maftir -PARSHAS ZACHOR, Devarim, Chapter 25 Verses 17 - 19

- In the Martir of "Zachor" we are commanded by Hashem to destroy the nation of Amalek.
- Even though Bnail Yisrael posed no hostility or threat against them, Amalek still tried to destroy and wipe them out completely, solely because of their pure hatred towards Hashem.

## Haftorah -PARSHAS ZACHOR, 18T Book of Samuel, Chapter 15, Verses 1 - 34

- Every member of Amalek happened to be in the same place at the same time, So Hashem ordered Shaul Hamelech (King Saul) and his men, to go and totally wipe them out once and for all.
- Obeying Shmuel Hanavi's (Samuel the prophet) instructions, the mission was a success. However, Shaul showed mercy towards King Agag (Amalek's King and leader) allowing him to live; saving Amalek from total annihilation and extinction.
- Despite Shmuel praying on his behalf, for contravening Hashem's command, Shaul lost his right to remain as the Jewish Nation's King.

#### SNAPSHOT GUIDE THROUGH THE SIDDER: Pesukei D'Zimrah - Ashrei (part 7)

- Verse 11 of Ashrel as our sages explain refers to the 'Laws of Nature' testifying to the fact that only someone with infinite intelligence could have exquisitely designed, created and sustain comprehensively the natural order in all aspects relating to the world and all of its inhabitants that keeps us alive and well.
- 4 The Maibim teaches in relation to verse 12 that aithough it's humanly impossible to distinguish every single miracle that Hashem performs for our benefit every moment of our lives. We as righteous Jews have a duty to recognise and acknowledge and even study Hashem's wisdom and mastery that is constantly guiding the world to be able to teach the rest of us how to thank and praise to Hashem with all our hearts and passion.

#### WEEKLY DISCUSSION:

After dealing with the all the measurements, materials required and other specifications relating to the construction of the Mishkan; this week's sedra now moves it attention towards the garments every Kohanim and the Kohen Gadol must wear whilst performing their sacred duties. One of the Items being the Ephod (apron) which the torah describes as an elaborate garment worn by the Kohen Gadol, and upon which the Hoshen (breastplate) containing the Urim and V'tumin.is attached.

To enable the ephod tobe fastened in place, two sardonyx stones were fixed in settings of gold onto the shoulders straps; one on the right, and one on the left; with the names of the tribes engraved on each (6 on one and 6 on the other) in accordance to Hashem's instructions.

According to the Biblical instructions and rabbinical traditions, the Hoshen is a patterned brocade just like the ephod with the threads of its intertwined fabric being made from gold, sky-blue, dark red and crimson wool, and linen.

In order to fix the Hoshen onto the ephod, another two square gold settings were fixed onto the shoulder straps directly under the sardonyx stones with golden chains extending from these settings throughgolden hooks that were thensewn into the rings of the breastplate.

The adomment known as the Urim and Vitumin is a set of four rows containing twelve small different varieties of gemstones, (3 gems per row) in settings of knitted or braided gold; representing each one of the twelve tribes of israel. The name of each corresponding tribe was etched onto each one.

The Torah describes both of these sets of jewels as being 'Remembrance Stones'. Our commentator's explain the meaning of this expression: When the designated Kohen Gadol on Yom Kippur would enter into the 'Holy of Holles' dressed in his priestly garb, before issuing his 'Divine Judgments' upon his people, Hashem in his mercy would take notice of all the tribes inscribed on the Ephod and the Hoshen and be spiritually aroused, allowing him to listen to the Kohen Gadol's supplications, confessions and prayers on Brial Yisrael's behalf enabling him to forgive all sins and continue to protecthis beloved nation from harm.

During the time of the Mishkan and when the two Bels Hamigdosh's were standing, Bnai Yisrael was remembered as a peaceful nation who put their hearts and soul intoreconnecting themselves to Hashem. Today as we unfortunately don't possess either. We should all remember and internalise the messages served from both the Ephod and the HoshenMishpat. To invoke the whole land of Israel with sustenance and material welfare, bringing it and her Jewish inhabitants salvation, deliverance from her enemies and ultimate peace speedily in our days. Amen
