SUNDAY 12 NOVEMBER "WOMEN OF FAITH STANDING TOGETHER"

The Ahmadiyya Muslims believe the Messiah has come. They are, accordingly, a group much persecuted by other Muslims. Their recurrent call of 'Love for All; Hatred for None' has motivated their formation of interfaith groups, such as the women's group that meets in Southall, which members of Ealing Synagogue have attended over several years.

On Sunday 12 November 2017, the Ahmadiyya Muslim Women's Association Middlesex hosted a forum entitled Women of Faith Standing Together, held at the Baitul Aman Mosque in Uxbridge. The association aims to provide women with a structure to train and enhance their religious and academic knowledge and to raise awareness of women's status and responsibilities while stressing their wider duties, including their contributions to the society in which they live.

The forum was the first of a series, in which members of one other faith group would be invited to each meeting. Approximately 50 people attended this first forum. The Jewish community was well represented,

including members of Ealing United Synagogue, Ealing Liberal Synagogue, Edgware Reform Synagogue, Kol Chai (Hatch End) Jewish Community and the League of Jewish Women. The meeting was addressed by Navida Sayed of the Ahmadiyya Muslim Women's Association and Farzana Yousaf, one of its national representative, by Rabbi Naomi from Kol Chai, and by Anna Less of Abrahamic Reunion, an international movement started in Israel, using religion as a force for peace. Questions and discussion from the floor followed, including a contribution from a young Palestinian woman who grew up in Israel. Although on-going politics was discussed, the meeting was more concerned with UK domestic issues and the contributions that can be made by individuals at the local level.

Conversations and discussions continued over Kosher and Halal refreshments, and as we read posters in an exhibition about Islam and its observance and philosophy. This meeting was an example of the very many attempts at interfaith dialogue at national and international levels. It is encouraging that so many professional, educated women are lending their skills to these valuable ends.

International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women 25 November



History of the Day

Women's activists have marked 25 November as a day against violence since 1981. This date came from the brutal assassination in 1960, of the three Mirabal sisters, political activists in the Dominican Republic, on orders of Dominican ruler Rafael Trujillo (1930-1961).

On 20 December 1993 the General Assembly, by <u>resolution 48/104</u>, adopted the Declaration on the Elimination of Violence against Women.

In this context, in 1999 the United Nations General Assembly designated 25 November as the International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women, and invited governments, international organizations and NGOs to organize on that day activities designed to raise public awareness of the problem.
