PARKINSON'S DISEASE RESEARCH PARKINSON'S PROGRESSION MARKERS INITIATIVE (PPMI)

Ashkenazi Jews have a higher likelihood of carrying one of two genes that have been identified in the onset of Parkinson's Disease. The Parkinson's Progression Markers Initiative (PPMI) is an ongoing study, supported by the NHS, investigating these gene mutations within the Community with a view to improving understanding of the disease and developing new treatments and strategies to prevent the onset.

Significantly, not everyone who has the gene mutation will go on to develop Parkinson's Disease, and this research is trying to understand why some people do go on to develop Parkinson's Disease and others do not.

The study is looking for Ashkenazi Jews who have Parkinson's Disease, or who have a relative with Parkinson's Disease, to volunteer to participate in this study. It is free to take part, and involves either a face-to-face meeting with a researcher at Charing Cross Hospital (travel expenses will be reimbursed) or registering on the website <https://www.michaeljfox.org/page.html?ppmi-genetics> and a saliva kit will be posted out from the US. Free genetic counselling is offered to review the test results.

CAMBRIDGE UNIVERSITY LIBRARY**

Ealing Synagogue is arranging a visit to see the latest exhibition of the Cairo Genizah, the largest single collection of medieval Jewish manuscripts and many other examples of everyday life for Jews living in the Middle East at that time. Many of the documents have not been on show before and most have now been translated into English.

The curator of the exhibition, Dr. Melonie Schmierer-Lee, will give a talk for about 35-40 minutes and there will be time afterwards to look at the exhibition and ask questions of Melonie.

The mini-coach will leave Grange Road at 9.30 am, and then Stanmore Station at 10.15am. We plan to arrive at Cambridge University Library by about 11.30 am. The talk will start at 12.00pm prompt. Arrangements for lunch will be made.

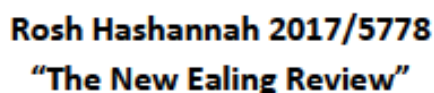
