SHABBAT 3 FEBRUARY VISIT BY THE ISRAELI AMBASSADOR

Last Shabbat, Ealing Synagogue was privileged to host the Ambassador of Israel, Mark Regev. The Ambassador read the prayers for the State of Israel and the IDF soldiers. He spoke during the service about the many significant anniversaries commemorated in 2017, that Israel is the centre for all things technological and that the rest of the world is now looking towards Israel for technical advancement and innovation. Although he did not make any political or controversial statements, he also said that Israel is now talking to its Arab neighbours more than ever before. This year's Israel Independence Day will mark the 70th anniversary of the State of Israel and we should review at how far Israel has come since its recognition in 1948, and look towards the future. After the service, the Ambassador mingled with the congregants during Kiddush and said that visiting synagogues outside of central London is his way of getting to know British Jewry.

HOLOCAUST MEMORIAL DAY EVENT TUESDAY 6 FEBRUARY

For the first time, Ealing Synagogue hosted two local schools, Villiers and Brentside, as part of the Northwood and Pinner Liberal Synagogue Holocaust Memorial Day Event. Facilitators Dawn Shestopal, Alison Shindler, Rosemary Grainger, Judith Robinson and Marianne Temple led workshops on the Holocaust, after which the students listened to the personal experiences of our guest speakers Peter and Marianne Summerfield, refugees from Germany in 1938. The session ended with a small ceremony of the lighting of a candle and a minute's silence to remember the victims of the Holocaust. Helen Mars then read the poem, "First They Came" by Pastor Martin Niemoller.

The feedback has been very positive from the school teachers and students and we hope to repeat this programme again next year. Our thanks to all the volunteers for helping to make this event so successful.

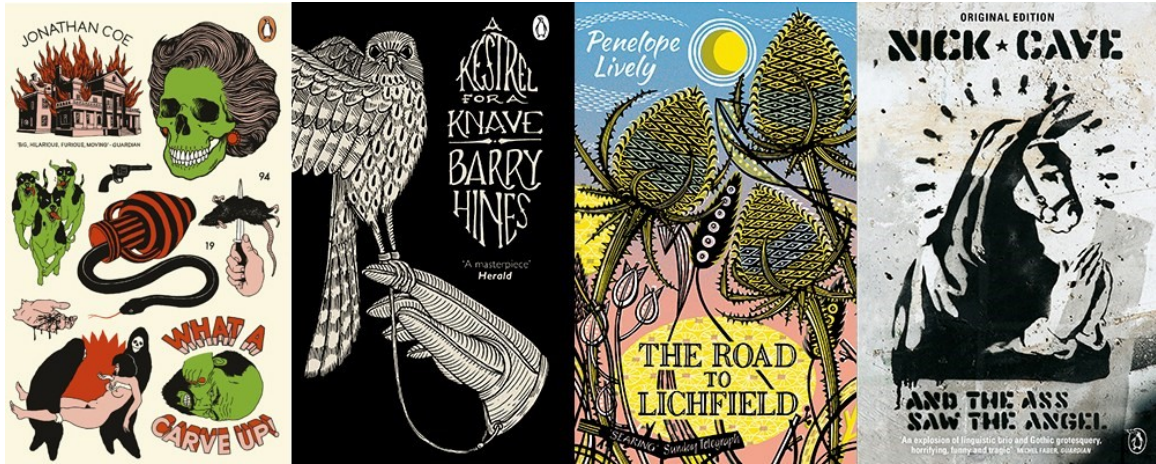
